How to Measure the Grade Level of Your Document

To measure grade level, use the instrument built into your word processor.

Caution: Grade level is just one aspect of readability. For a more complete evaluation, contact Transcend.

For Microsoft Word MAC 2008 and 2011

- 1. Go to the Word menu
- 2. Click "Preferences..."
- 3. Click "Spelling and Grammar"
- 4. Make sure "Check grammar with spelling" is checked, then check "show readability statistics"
- 5. Go to the "Tools" menu
- 6. Click "Spelling and Grammar..." and complete the spelling and grammar check*

For Microsoft Word PC 2003

- 1. Go to the Tools menu
- 2. Click "Options..."
- 3. Click "Spelling and Grammar" Tab
- 4. Make sure "Check grammar with spelling" is checked, then check "show readability statistics"
- 5. Go to the "Tools" menu
- 6. Click "Spelling and Grammar..." and complete the spelling and grammar check*

For Microsoft Word PC 2007

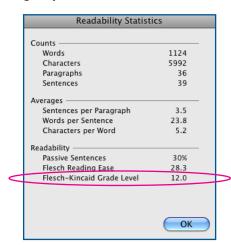




- 2. Click "Word Options" (bottom, right of menu)
- 3. Click "Proofing"
- 4. Make sure "Check grammar with spelling" is checked, then check "show readability statistics"
- 5. Go to the "Tools" menu
- 6. Click "Spelling Check" in the "Quick Access" Toolbar and complete the spelling and grammar check*

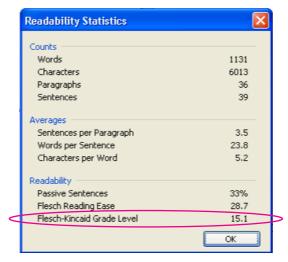
